Lesson 9 - November 9, 2014

Dependence on the Holy Spirit

It is impossible to overstate the challenge that the believing community faced as a result of Jesus' death. Jesus' death and departure presented the disciples, and the church, with a crisis far greater than simply the loss of

their teacher and friend. If the revelation of God is rooted in the incarnation, what happens when Jesus is gone? It is the genius of John's Gospel to present the Spirit as the solution to this crisis. Throughout Jesus' words about the Spirit, the emphasis repeatedly falls on the Spirit as the one who will continue Jesus' work after his absence, as the one who will make it possible for the experience of God made known and available in the incarnation to be known after Jesus' death. Following the resurrection, the disciples response to Jesus in the opening verses of Acts demonstrates that their questions weren't that different from ours (Acts 1:6). If nothing else, Jesus' response points to the Holy Spirit as the catalyst for empowering his disciples to be witnesses for the kingdom of God. Indeed, our mission receives its authenticity from the Spirit. The presence of the Spirit is here to transform us, and in the process of this transformation, develop our giftedness. We are transformed and gifted by the Spirit for the sake of participating in mission—the mission of God in both our local community and the world.

"I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come." John 16:12-13

- 1. Where do you see the Spirit working in your life, workplace, marriage, and family?
- 2. How do we distinguish and discern the voice of God (the leading of the Spirit) from all the voices that speak so loudly in today's culture?
